CORNERSTONE, NEW FLAG, AND THE VIRUS

Well, here we are in October, and we continue to plan for in-person activities. Yet, the virus still haunts us. After the summer of darkness (the suspension of Masonic meetings), our September monthly meeting and chili cook-off had to be cancelled due to several nobles and ladies' exposure to the virus. We did hold the meeting on Zoom that went very well but not like our normal return each Fall. The good news is that our cornerstone was dedicated and installed. The Grand Lodge, El Jebel Nobles, and guests had a great celebration at the official cornerstone laying on 28 August. The stone looks magnificent as you enter the building. Take time to stop and see it the next time you are at the Temple. After a long wait for delivery, our outside Nation's Flag has been replaced with a bright, shining new one. The old Flag was worn and tattered.

What transpired at our September Zoon meeting? On 13 September at 7:00 pm, the Potentate opened with a welcome and talked about the virus spreading among brothers and their families thus, the need to have our meeting on Zoom. He then asked Chaplain Jim Oliver to give an invocation followed by Jim Dawkins, High Priest & Prophet leading all in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of our Nation. Noble Robert Walker sang the *National Anthem* and *I'm Proud to be an American*. Noble Kent Burns, Master of Ceremonies, introduced our attending dignitaries: Past Potentates Illustrious Sirs Dick Williams, Ron Cosens, Matt Raia, Dennis Proctor, Phil Hause, Rich Silver, Bobby Marner, Joe Kent, and Past Imperial Chaplain Greg Rindone.

IS Rich Silver, PP, Treasurer, reported that all accounts are reconciled and gave a summary of the financial reports. There being no questions, his report was moved, seconded, and approved. The Recorder's report stated that our current membership was Regular 785, Associate 39, Total, 824. Not recorded are two deaths received this morning: Nobles Don Schultz and Glenn Moore an Associate bringing our total to 822. Remember, Shriners International (SI) has already amended the membership rolls (Web Fez) to reflect the 2022 dues, thus those in arrears will be subject to suspension. If you are one of the 35, with a grateful thank you, please send your 2021 dues to the office. The Recorder's Report was moved, seconded, and approved.

The Membership Committee is developing methods and programs to interest new members. If any Noble has ideas to interest our brother Masons in becoming a Shriner, please contact Noble Grady Carter, Assistant Rabban. Noble Grady has said he wants everyone to

help increase membership. Ken Jones, Chief Rabban, informed all that the Nut Sales Program is in full operation now and you may order nuts by completing an order form at the office. The price is the same as at a store, but we get about three dollars a bag for sales. This is another great way to support your Temple. Get those nuts you need for the holidays and for gifts. The 50/50 Raffle will be at every in person monthly meeting. The Whiskey Sales will begin shortly at \$55 per bottle. When you see what is available, you will want to buy.

Noble Greg Rindone, Trustee, reported the outside Flag replacement is flying high over our building.

There are quite a few applicants looking at Suites 120 and 390 and some are very promising. Carpet is being replaced in Suite 120. There are three new bricks purchased for our Plaza Memorial Wall, so let people know there are many more spaces available to honor those you love and respect.

IS Ron reported that the CSSA in Oklahoma went well, and the Dune Buggy Patrol won the First-in-Show Trophy. The Obstacle Course was new and rough. Practice will be required for next year's competition in Wichita, Kansas. IS Rich asked for volunteers to sell CDs at Red Rocks, Lynyrd Skynyrd Concert, on 27 September form 5:30 to 9:30 pm. All volunteering may stay for the complete concert. Monies will go to the Shriners Children's, new name for Shriners Hospitals for Children. He also reported the Salt Lake City Hospital is now a clinic working with the local children's hospital that now does all surgeries.

Ken Jones, Leadership Search Committee Chair, asked IS Joe Kent, a committee member, to report on their recommendations for 2022 officers. The recommendation is for elected officers to advance in position and for the Oriental Guide position to be filled by Noble Kent Burns.

There will be a Ceremonial followed by Oktoberfest at our Temple on 16 October. Get those petitions in for this event. New nobles are wanted and needed, and you are the ones that can make it happen. On Wednesday, 27 October we will have a Tenant Appreciation Luncheon at El Jebel to thank and honor our Building Tenants.




OPTARS






New Social Unit Forming
