
Doug Kelley, High Priest & Prophet, and his team are



Out on the northeastern plains of our fair state you will find a group of hardy men who withstand the wind and weather (hot and windy in the summer, cold and windy in the winter) and still manage to do good for their community, as well as El Jebel. They even have a club out there – the Northeast Colorado Shrine Club. These Nobles put on a (Robbie) Burns dinner every January (or sometimes in early February) and give some of us a bad time for wearing kilts – as well as a good meal. The one handing out the most abuse (in the most friendly manner) was hard to corner for our little interview. Finally, after six months, he filled out the questionnaire so his exploits could be set to words.

Cecil Souders is a life-long resident of Sterling, having come into this world some seventy-two years ago this month (April). He is one of the majority of Americans who still live within fifty miles of his birthplace. After graduating from Sterling High School, he attended Northeast Junior College, majoring in auto technology. He married Helen Hicks 51 years ago and they had two children, Kendra and Scott. Sadly, Scott was killed in an auto accident when he was just eighteen. However, in a sense he lived on – he was an organ donor. His heart enabled another man to live for twenty-six more years. Helen and Cecil are also the proud grandparents of four and great-grandparents of three more.

Cecil's father-in-law was instrumental in starting his Masonic journey, and it has been a most complete one. He is a Past Master of Sterling #54, Thrice Illustrious Master, Past High Commander, active in Scottish Rite, and has held all the offices in the NECSC. He even found time to join the BPOE (local Elks club). With 22 years as a Shriner, he is proud of the efforts of all the members of the local club, which has raised many a dollar for the hospital through their annual Fourth of July fireworks sales. They used to put up a tent and can regale you with stories of the adventures experienced when sleeping overnight to "guard" their "product."

While he didn't mention this as a memorable event, it sums up his outlook on life: When asked (in the questionnaire) "his heritage," he simply replied "American." A single word that speaks volumes.

In order to provide for his family (and pay dues to his many organizations) Cecil put in 43 years with Sterling Redi-Mix. Somehow, he also found enough time to become a Captain in the Logan County Sheriff's Posse and the Firearms Instructor for Sterling Rifle Club. Here he taught kids and women gun safety as well as how to shoot. He is justifiably proud of the fact that, even today, he receives "thank you's" from past students for his efforts. He is still very active, enjoying hunting, fishing, repairing things, and spending time with his family. When asked if he had any childhood fantasies, such as becoming an astronaut, he replied, "No, I like to keep my feet on the ground."But didja know that Cecil once aspired to be a cook? Seems like back when he was a strapping lad of fifteen, he decided he would bake a cherry pie. So, he hauled out his dad's recipe book and proceeded to start on the crust. After he had poured out two pounds of salt and ten pounds of flour, he asked his mom if she had fifty more pounds. Guess she got a little upset and asked if Cecil could read. And where was he planning

on getting fifty gallons of cherries? And 250 pie tins? His "recipe" yielded 250 cherry pies. It was his dad's Navy cookbook! Dear ole dad had been a cook aboard an aircraft carrier. Wonder where Cecil planned on finding an oven that big!?

Several of our members are putting together up-coming socials and these will be announced very soon. Thanks to all who stepped up to handle these tasks.




