



El Jebel Shrine Transportation Shriners Hospitals for Children

We all support it, we all fundraise for it, but also do you know how our patent transportation operates and the countless hours of dedication goes into accommodating patient's visit?

The process begins when a transportation request, entered on the El Jebel website, is received by the Transportation Coordinator. The patient and guardian information are verified for accuracy. This may require a call to family for clarification or to obtain additional information.

Next, a call is made to the Hospital or Clinic providing the service. The appointment date and time are verified.

Now the tough part, the coordinator must determine the mode of transportation that best fits the patient's appointment. A decision to fly or drive is made. When flying, research is done to determine what airline and available flights are best.

When driving, the most direct route must be taken (Google Maps is used to verify), upon return a mileage reimbursement request is submitted. After the coordinator calls to verify patient did attend their appointment, the request is submitted to El Jebel's office for payment.

Every effort is made to provide the most economical means. Only the patient and their one designated guardian are paid for through our Transportation Fund. In all cases, El Jebel's patient transportation policy is followed.

We transport the majority of our patient to Shriners Children's Salt Lake, a few to Philadelphia, and occasionally to Sacramento, Chicago, and Greenville.

While the process seems straight forward, many hours are spent by our coordinator ensuring the travel experience is positive for the patient and guardian. Below are a few topics that require extra time and dedication.

Researching and answering patent questions

Resolving transportation conflicts by working with guardians to find a solution

Guardians have direct access to coordinator through personal cell phone

Contacting the hospitals when necessary

Sunshine brought record-setting heat, thankfully interrupted by afternoon squalls of wind, rain, and cooler temperatures. Flash flood warnings were issued for the immediate surrounding area as heavy rain and pea-sized hail played their rhythms on the rooftops of various R.V.'s, creating some consternation and hopes that the little ice balls wouldn't get bigger and create damage to the shiny rigs.

Jim and Sherri Marshall experienced their "Baptism by Fire" with this first experience as Wagonmasters. The deserve much more than "honorable mention" and thanks for their planning and execution of a great weekend. Thursday was check-in day; Friday found some restful gatherings and conversations at various rigs during the heat of the day, and after breakfast on Saturday, we held our regular monthly business meeting. We were reminded of future planned events including our Caravan to Custer South Dakota upcoming in September. The meeting was adjourned and followed by the Brown Bag Auction during which various useful new items are placed in anonymous plain brown paper bags. Members and guests bid on each bag, with bidding wars, laughter, and escalating amounts to as much as \$50 or more for several bags. The funds collected from this fun event are held with other such fund raising activities until the end of each year at which time every dime collected is presented to our Potentate as a donation for Shriners Children's Salt Lake City. This auction raised \$681.00 with a second auction planned for the Custer South Dakota Caravan. This was followed by several members embarking on a trip to the Colorado Territorial Prison Museum in Canon City. The prison museum is retained as it was built, a Federal Prison in 1879, and utilized until the new and current adjacent Colorado State Territorial Prison was built just to the west. The museum is filled with historical photos, articles, and artifacts while recognizing what is now considered to be "primitive" and "cruel" punishment for inmates. During a transition of facilities, the Territorial Prison was used to house females.

Upon returning to the R.V. 




