# Phishing Season Is Open. Be Vigilant!

Phishing is a type of social-engineering attack often used to steal user data, including log-in credentials and credit card numbers. It occurs when an attacker, masquerading as a trusted entity, dupes a victim into opening an e-mail, instant message, or text message. The recipient is then tricked into clicking a malicious link, which can lead to the installation of malware, the freezing of the system as part of a ransomware attack, or the revealing of sensitive information.

In a typical e-mail case, you will receive an e-mail that appears to come from a known person or company that you recognize and do business with, such as your financial institution. The e-mail will probably warn you of a request that requires your immediate attention. In many cases, a quick check of the e-mail return address or the originating text number will tip you off.

Many Nobles have received e-mails and texts claiming to originate from me. These unscrupulouss people sending them are hoping you will fall for their scam. Be assured, my e-mail, AT&T phone, and your El Jebel office server have not been hacked. Here is an example of a spam e-mail or text you may receive:

Hello. Are you less busy at the moment? I got a request for you to manage discreetly. I will be going into a meeting shortly, please no calls so kindly respond back via e-mail.

Yours in the Faith,

Ill. Sir Ken Jones

Please be assured I will not ask you to buy anything or to send an e-mail for a private conversation. Do not get hooked by these phishing schemes. Below are articles worth reading:

# **WAGON TRAIN?**

September 17<sup>th</sup> marked the departure of a Shriners' "Wagon Train" for the Black Hills of South Dakota. The newer "wagons" are now made of steel, aluminum and fiberglass, riding on rubber tires, and powered by much more horsepower than what was provided by the old horse / oxen drawn models of the Old West.

The trek began at the Johnson's Corner truck stop and restaurant where giant cinnamon rolls are the most popular fare. As previously "scouted" by Wagonmaster Jim Stewart, the caravan made its way north through Cheyenne, the gateway to the "nothingness" of Wyoming. Although the worst of Wyoming highways outclass the best of those in Colorado's pothole farms, the "attractions", pit/potty stops and refueling locations are few and expensive! Strong wind is the primary natural resource of Wyoming, often forcing our modern "wagons" to frequently correct their trajectories along the roadways.

As the Caravan turned to the east at Newcastle, the scenery instantly changed to beautiful scenic forests, rock formations, and roadways that were creatively constructed to negotiate the twists and turns through the Black Hills National Forest. The former campground of General George Custer now serves as the beautiful R.V. park where we were welcomed by the owners, checked in quickly and settled in for the evening.

With so much to see in the Black Hills, only two group destinations were on our schedule. The first was a drive through Custer State Park's scenic wonderland where "big rigs" would be considered foolish and dangerous to use on the narrow "pathways" which culminate at the Mount Rushmore National Memorial. Our group arrived in time to visit the food court for dinner, and a walk through the "Avenue of Flags" which leads to the amphitheater below the mountain upon which the faces of Presidents Washington, Jefferson, Roosevelt and Lincoln are carved in the granite. The National Park Service presentation featured an interesting historical review of the Presidents is followed by the entire audience standing to sing our National Anthem together, during which the mountain is instantly lighted, revealing the faces of the "fabulous four" Presidents – a very stunning sight which brought gasps of surprise and admiration from everyone. The closing of this ceremony is accomplished by the calling of all military veterans to the stage where our American Flag proudly waves throughout the day. On this day, "Old Glory" flew at half-staff to honor lives lost in service to our nation. Several veterans are asked to participate with the retiring of the colors. Two of the veterans chosen included our own retired U.S.A.F. Chief Master Sergeant Annette Stewart, and U.S. Army veteran Jim Oliver.

A "Present Arms" command brought all veterans to attention while rendering a salute that was maintained throughout the retirement of the flag. Once again, there were comments that "too much pollen" was in the air, creating "leaky eyes" during the ceremony. This program is a "must" for everyone when traveling to the Black Hills.

The other group event was a visit to "Bear Country" which is home to a variety of wildlife creatures, but primarily for dozens of bears. Visitors are cautioned to remain in their cars (with windows closed) while traveling through the areas in which the wildlife are well maintained. The bears are free to roam throughout their area, complete with "dens" in which they reside. Most of the animals in Bear Country are nocturnal hunters, and prefer to "hide" and rest during the warmer daylight hours, but the bears remain active throughout the "park". Recently weaned bear cubs are maintained together in their own enclosed area, all very entertaining to watch. This entire excursion was very much enjoyed by all present.

The areas of Hill City, Keystone, Custer, and Custer State Park contain an incredible variety of sights, sounds, restaurants, breweries, wine producers, all different than the average "tourist" fare. Just ask any of the Roamers present about the "Red Ass" rhubarb wine that many couldn't resist taking home.

Evening bonfires at the campground brought warmth, laughter and stories to all in the cool evening with hints of winter noticeably changing tree leaves to yellow and gold as observed each morning. The forecast of light rain and cold predicted for the day that the "Brown Bag Auction" was scheduled didn't materialize, so the auction went very well, bringing in several hundred dollars in bids, all destined to be utilized exclusively for the benefit of our "Shriners' Children". The participating owners of the R.V. Park posted auction advertising flyers inviting any and all who were staying at the park. We welcomed the surprise presence of a participating couple staying there whose daughter, now 35 years old was a patient at the Salt Lake Shriners Hospital when she was three years old, having been born with severely deformed feet and one hand. They related their "story" of tragedy and heartache to success and how their daughter is now enjoying a successful life with the post-surgical prostheses that were made for her by Shriners hospital technicians. Once again, that "pollen" in the air caused "leaky eyes" with several who were present. No words can describe how grateful these parents are for the life altering treatment that their daughter and their family received from Shriners.

Many great experiences were shared with all present during this week. The ever present "RV Gremlin", caused some electrical issues with the Marshall's RV tail lights and an auto-leveling jack, and on the way home, bits of tire rubber were being thrown away by an inside rear dual tire as it disintegrated on Dattilo's RV.


