#### **DROVERS**

#### ~ STEVE STEVENS

For the month of May I thought I would shift gears a bit from what we have been sharing about the early Drovers and cover an event that happened in roughly the same time period. We all love to celebrate Cinco de Mayo, the 5<sup>th</sup> of May, but we sometimes forget why this date is important to everyone, but more specifically, to Masons. Cinco de Mayo is a very important date that, if the events had not occurred on this date in 1862, both Mexico and the United States of America may have been very different places.


We start the story on July 17, 1861, when then-Mexican President Benito Juarez, his country facing bankruptcy, made the decision to suspend all foreign debt repayments. Spain, England, and France, to all of which Mexico owed money, joined in alliance to send forces to Mexico to demand repayment. Spain sailed into the Mexican city of Veracruz on December 14, 1861 and took possession of the port, followed by France. A peaceful agreement was eventually reached between Mexico, Spain, and England but France, led by Napoleon III, made it clear that he wanted to establish an empire in Mexico.

In April of 1862, France began its march from Veracruz to Mexico City with somewhere between 6,000 and 8,000 troops. On their way to take Mexico City by force, they ran into a surprising resistance at the town of Puebla led by our brother, Ignacio Zaragoza. Brother Zaragoza was born in the village of Bahía del Espíritu Santo, a province of Mexico called Coahuila y Tejas, known today as Goliad, Texas. Next time you see me, ask about one of our other brothers, James Fannin and the battle of Goliad!

OK, a little more about Brother Zaragoza. He was a cousin of Brother Juan Seguin who delivered the eulogy for our fallen brothers at the Alamo. Brother Zaragoza led a poorly equipped Mexican army of about half the size of the French to a surprise victory over their much better equipped French counterparts. This was quite unexpected and set the French army back by a year. About a year after meeting in Puebla, the French returned with a much larger force and were able to march all the way to Mexico City seating Maximilian I as the new ruler of Mexico.

Here's the significance: it's common thought that if the French Army had marched unabated to Mexico City in 1862, they would have joined with the confederacy in the US to create a dominant monarchy in North America. So, the battle of Puebla, on Cinco de Mayo (unknown to many of us) was one of many decisive victories that have contributed to the country we call "home" today. This year, when you tip your margarita or beer glass on the fifth of May and wish someone a happy "Cinco de Mayo," remember that it was a fellow mason, trying to make good men better, who set in motion the world that we enjoy today.


