





2024 Dues Notices will start going out September 1st

Please remember that you will be receiving dues notices for the 2024 year. Such are due by 31 December of the preceding year — that means your dues for 2024 are due into the office by 31 December 2023. El Jebel must pay to Shriners International the *per capita* and hospital assessment of every member on 1 January. In essence, El Jebel is financing the *per capita* and hospital portion of any Noble who has not paid his dues by year-end.

Also, to keep the doors open at Shriners International, increasing costs forced the Imperial Session of July, 2023 in Charlotte to raise the *per capita* of each Noble by \$20.00 annually. This should have been done last year but financial necessities forced the issue this year with the possibility that, without this increase of a mere 5.5¢ per day, the possibility of going out of business was a real thing.

2023 Imperial Session, Charlotte, NC July 2-6, 2023 Legislative Update

The 2023 Imperial Session in Charlotte, NC from July 2-6, 2023 involved many important legislative considerations. As most of you know, the session encompasses amendments and resolutions for both Shriners International (an Iowa Corporation) and Shriners Hospitals for Children (a Colorado Corporation) and well as elections for Imperial Outer Guard and any open Hospital Trustee positions (there were three open Trustee positions this year). The results of those elections were:

Newly-elected Shriners Children's Board of Trustees are

Leslie Stewart, M.D., Returning Ken Aguilera, M.D., Returning Timothy Ludwig, New

Newly-elected Shriner's Imperial Divan Outer Guard is David C. Hamm of Sharon Shriners, TX.

While all the proposed Shriners International resolutions were house-keeping issues (address changes, etc.), the proposed amendments included two important changes. The first, voted down unanimously, was the proposal to drop the requirement to be a Master Mason.

The second important amendment was to raise the International per capita dues. Currently the per capita is \$30 per year. This was last raised seven years ago, in 2016, from \$15 to \$30 per year. There have been proposed amendments in prior years to raise it that were voted down. Apparently, many felt that Shriners International didn't make a clear enough financial case for an increase. This year, webinars prior to this year's session reviewed Shriners International's finances and those were again presented at the Session for all to hear. Shriners International has worked to contain their operating expenses and reductions in Imperial Divan and Session spending (lower in both areas than in 2013). 2022 also brought investment loses that reduced the net assets from \$12.7M to \$10.9. Rising healthcare costs for Shriners International staff added to those losses, bringing the total loss to \$2M. Those losses cannot be sustained for but a few years before the fraternal side ceases to exist.

Initially, a proposal to increase *per capita* from \$30 to \$60 per year was voted down just 5 votes shy of the two-thirds required (of the 611 Iowa reps). The next day a motion to reconsider was brought by a majority voter (dissenting vote) and subsequently an amendment to the original proposed amendment was brought forth from the floor to raise *per capita* by only \$20 per year. After a long discussion period, this amended proposal was passed with 442 affirmative votes and 176 dissenting votes. Therefore your 2024 dues statement will show a *per capita* of \$50, \$5 for the Hospitals, and \$100 for El Jebel dues, for a total of \$155 for the 2024 year, due by December 31, 2023. m

I would remind you that you may purchase a Shriners International Permanently Contributing Life Membership at the 2023 rate through the office until December 31, 2023. I would also note that El Jebel has worked hard to keep its costs down, though we do not have staff with health benefits that continue to rise. We have not raised El Jebel's dues since 2003.

DROVERS OF EL JEBEL

Brother Charles Goodnight, Oliver Loving's best friend, was not just a Mason and a drover, but he also has the distinction of inventing the chuck wagon in 1866. "Chuck" was the slang word for food back then and the chuck wagon always provided a hearty meal to support the drovers working on the drive. Chuck wagons carried everything the drovers would need on their long journeys driving cattle to the railheads in Colorado and Kansas. Goodnight had the idea to repurpose an army surplus wagon made by Studebaker with durable wood and built shelves, drawers for plates and utensils, a hinged wooden bench for preparing the meals, and wooden barrel(s) to carry water.

The designated cook, or "Cookie" as he was affectionately known, oversaw the chuck wagon, including meal preparation, and was often considered second-in-charge of a cattle drive. Cookie and his assistant would ride ahead of the drovers and cattle to scout out the next best camping location. Cookie had the responsibility of getting the fire going early in the morning for the most important meal of the day, breakfast.

Cookie had other responsibilities like barber, doctor, dentist, counselor, and direction-setter. As the counselor, Cookie embodied a lot of the same values we hold true in Freemasonry. He taught the drovers how to be grateful for everything they received and for each other. He taught them etiquette with rules such as: No one eats until Cookie calls out, No one takes the last piece of food until everyone has taken their meal, clean your plate, and strangers are always welcome. It is said that in his role as direction-setter, Cookie would survey the night sky looking for the North Star, Polaris. He would line up the tongue of the wagon with the North Star so that in the morning, the crew only had to align themselves with the tongue to know the direction to move.

Coffee was the mainstay of breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Making a good cup of coffee on the range is an art-form compared to the convenient ways we make coffee today. I am sure that many people envision a cup of cowboy coffee with a spoon standing straight up in the cup, but I can assure you that it is, in fact, one of the best cups of coffee you can drink. Cowboy coffee starts in a large pot, two gallons or more. It's usually heated on a flat rock next to the campfire or in a Dutch-oven directly over the fire. A cup and a half of fresh ground coffee is added to the water and brought to a rolling boil. After a few minutes of a really good rolling boil, the coffee is almost ready. The final step is to pour a bit of cold water down the spout to help the grounds settle to the bottom. Only then is it ready to be poured in the cup.

So, there you have it. We have the story of how a Mason from 1866 designed the first food truck. Without Brother Goodnight's invention, who knows if we would even have food trucks today!

Last year the Drovers of El Jebel took a road trip down to the Flying W Ranch in Colorado Springs where we experienced a chuck-wagon-style dinner and great harmonizing of Americana music from the Flying W Wranglers. A good time was had by all and if you are looking to step back in time, this drover recommends it.

It's been a very slow summer. In the past, summer has been the busy part of the year, with five or six Highland Games, several parades, and a few social events thrown in for good measure. But, like so many other things, time has taken a toll on all things Celtic, not to mention on the Band members themselves. We are no longer a parade unit – now a social unit with parade privileges, a move deemed necessary by the length of the average tooth in the Band. But that is not the only reason for the decline of performance requests; all the pipe bands in the area are suffering a similar decline. We have lost four local Highland Games, and those still operating are doing so on a much smaller scale. We have lost three or four pipe bands, and the remaining bands are all substantially smaller than ten or even five years ago. And it wasn't all "just Covid."

But this Band is maintaining a positive outlook on our future and that of the Shrine and Freemasonry as a whole. We have shifted our focus to quality rather than quantity. Our repertoire is arguably the biggest in the area. When the other bands are diligently working on their competition sets, we are just as diligently working on new tunes, most of which of late are Grade Three or Grade Two tunes. (To the uninitiate, tunes are graded from Five through One then Open according to their difficulty. In this area, there are several Grade Four bands and, depending on the year, one or two Grade Three Bands. Higher grades seem to be in short supply around here lately.) We jokingly say "We need another Braveheart." When that movie came out in the '90's, there was a definite increase not only in learning to play the pipes, but also in requests for everything from parties, to weddings, to Scottish-themed events, to just about any occasion or excuse to include kilts, pipes, haggis (why I'll never figure out), jousting, etc. People were not so wrapped up in their phones and actually wanted to learn to play the pipes, even knowing that it is not an immediate-gratification undertaking. In fact, it takes 18 to 24 months to become somewhat proficient on the contrary things – one actually needs to learn everything three times (first on the chanter, then on the full pipes, then full pipes while marching). Todav's "student" is scared off after they realize they won't be playing jigs or even gigs by Friday.

Another thing we as a Band have done is to take Masonry to the masses, so to speak. We are a Third-Degree team, available to anyone that so desires. In the last few years, we have raised twenty or more Master Masons – pretty good PR for the fraternity, one could say. Any unit could specialize in a degree and do the same thing. We need candidates. To get candidates, we need good men to become Masons. Our little band of merry music makers is trying hard to do our part in the search for more Masons.

As always, we will be at the Shrine (almost) every Thursday evening and can offer you a hearty welcome should you come on down to learn piping or other things Scottish, usually around 1830.


