



2024 Dues Notices will start going out September 1st

Please remember that you will be receiving dues notices for the 2024 year. Such are due by 31 December of the preceding year – that means your dues for 2024 are due into the office by 31 December 2023. El Jebel must pay to Shriners International the *per capita* and hospital assessment of every member on 1 January. In essence, El Jebel is financing the *per capita* and hospital portion of any Noble who has not paid his dues by year-end.

Also, to keep the doors open at Shriners International, increasing costs forced the Imperial Session of July, 2023 in Charlotte to raise the *per capita* of each Noble by \$20.00 annually. This should have been done last year but financial necessities forced the issue this year with the possibility that, without this increase of a mere 5.5¢ per day, the possibility of going out of business was a real thing.



DROVERS

~Steve Stevens, Trail Boss

We've already met Brother Charles Goodnight and know that he invented the chuck wagon and, along with Brother Oliver Loving, blazed the Goodnight-Loving cattle trail from Texas to Colorado. Brother Goodnight was born in 1836 to Charles and Charlotte Goodnight in Illinois. His father was a descendant of Hans Michael Gutknecht, an immigrant and early pioneer of Kentucky. Goodnight shares a lineage with another famous Brother and Noble, Harry S. Truman, the 33rd President of the United States.

After his father passed away, Brother Goodnight's mother remarried Hiram Daugherty (how fitting) and the family moved to Texas in 1946. At the age of 20, Charlie joined a local militia and a year later joined the Texas Rangers where he became known for leading a raid to rescue Cynthia Ann Parker, who was kidnapped and had been living with the Comanche. This raid later led to Parker's rescue and a treaty with her son, Quanah Parker. Quanah Parker became the principal chief of all the Comanche and was the main interpreter of white civilization. He's also known for encouraging education and agriculture and advocating on behalf of his people. But that's a whole other story...

Back to Brother Goodnight: As most people were at the time, he was involved in the Civil War, but it was after the war that he really made an impact. During the war, most of the longhorn cattle had become feral. That means they had escaped domestication and become wild again. Goodnight spent a lot of his time herding up the feral longhorns and, after meeting his friend Oliver Loving, began moving them westward and northward through New Mexico and into Colorado. For those of us who have traveled from Colorado to Texas (or back the other way) we have actually followed the Goodnight-Loving Trail. To get from New Mexico into Colorado, the trail went right over the Raton Pass where they had to pay a toll of 10 cents per head. To avoid this toll, Goodnight started pasturing and moving the cattle directly by the Capulin volcano in northeast New Mexico.

In 1868, Brother Goodnight settled the Rock Canyon Ranch just west of the new town of Pueblo, Colorado. He set up line camps between the Rock Canyon Ranch and Wetmore Colorado and ran cattle between the two. It was here that he and his ranch hands built the historic stone barn that still stands today. Back in the Texas panhandle, Brother Goodnight founded the JA Ranch near the Palo Duro Canyon in 1876 with his partner John Adair. In 1880, Brother Goodnight founded the Panhandle Stockman's Association which pursued improving cattle breeding as well as trying to eliminate cattle rustling. He is also known for preserving a herd of buffalo allowing the relocated Oklahoma tribes to visit and hunt them as they had in days gone by.

But cattle weren't his only concern. With his wife Mary Ann, they established the Goodnight Academy for the children of ranchers to provide them with an education past their elementary years. It eventually became a junior college, the first in the Texas Panhandle. Brother Goodnight donated 340 acres to the Academy where students could work to pay off part of their tuition. Mary Ann Goodnight died in 1926 and Brother Charles Goodnight died in 1929 at the age of 93.

Brother Charles Goodnight was inducted into the Hall of Great Westerners of the National Cowboy at Western Heritage Museum at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma in 1955.

William Schwartz Sentencing

Excerpts from an article in the Greeley Tribune:

William Schwartz, a former Noble, Treasurer and Business Manager, has been sentenced to 16 years in prison.

The punishment, unusually stiff for a whitecollar crime here, followed a three-hour hearing at which Judge Adam Espinosa heard about the life and crimes of William Schwartz.

"The money that you took — the average income in our community is \$78,000," Espinosa told the 44-year-old. "\$1.5 million — many in our community won't earn that in their lives."

While he was Treasurer of the El Jebel Shrine in Denver from 2014 to 2019, the Castle Rock man moved more than \$1.2 million that had been earmarked for the fraternal organization and Shriners Hospitals for Children to bank accounts for his companies.

Then, in 2019, Schwartz became treasurer of another organization, a Masonic group that also sends money to Shriners hospitals. Schwartz stole more than \$350,000 from it.

Schwartz was indicted in April 2022 and convicted by a jury in May of this year. Jurors found he had committed two counts of felony theft. At trial, Schwartz did not dispute the theft allegations but argued the charges had been filed too late, outside a statute of limitations.

"I don't think 'I'm sorry' is ever going to be enough for any of the people that I hurt," Schwartz told Espinosa just before he was sentenced Friday. "I cheated them," he said. "I cheated the people that the money was intended to help."

Schwartz said to his therapist, 'I got caught up in greed. I couldn't put an end to it. It was intoxicating,"

Deputy District Attorney Katie Kirk said that at the time of his arrest, "Mr. Schwartz was living an extraordinarily privileged life" with the money he stole. She listed a nearly million-dollar house, vacation home in southern Colorado and timeshare in Hawaii, a \$100,000 Lincoln, "\$30,000 in plastic Legos bought as a business venture," and \$12,000 in custom suits.

"This case is a bit of an aberration because we haven't seen victimization of a charitable organization on this scale since I have been at the DA's Office," said Kirk, who joined the office nine years ago.

"I know that we are all more than the worst thing that we've done but what you did here is significant. These are some of the most serious offenses in our system," Espinosa told Schwartz, noting that one charge was a Class 2 felony, on par with some murders.

"Your motive really seemed to focus on promoting your lifestyle. You really struck me as some-body who wanted to get ahead but perhaps decided that rather than put the hard work in, you would cheat others," the judge said. "This wasn't a real estate scam or a pyramid scheme, it was many years of taking money from a group of people who were your friends."

With that, he sentenced him to 16 years in prison for the theft from El Jebel and six years for the theft from the other organization, to run concurrently. Schwartz must also serve three years of probation and pay restitution. The amount of restitution will be decided at a later date.


"You'll get out of prison much sooner than you think," said Espinosa, noting defendants rarely serve a full sentence, "and I hope you can make good on your promise of restitution."

As the judge made his remarks, three Denver sheriff's deputies walked behind Schwartz and removed their handcuffs. He was arrested when the judge finished talking.

Schwartz's legal proceedings are far from over. In February, he was charged with one felony count of tax evasion and four felony counts of filing a false tax return between 2017 and 2020. He was scheduled to be arraigned in that case the day of sentencing however it has been postponed.

"I'm happy," a local Shriner, said after the hearing, then he paused, and added, "But I'm also sad."

COMPUTER CLUB




Our first meeting, returning from the dark of summer, will be Tuesday, September 12th.


